#### **Filling Out Your Application**

Your application must be legible and written in English, using proper grammar and spelling. Answer all questions completely; do not simply write "same" or "see above" or "see previous." Enter your information directly on the application unless directed otherwise. The question fields are enabled for typing, so you may type directly into the application.

Whenever the application asks for your name, enter your name exactly as it appears on your passport or birth certificate. Write your full name at the top of all application pages.

All dates should be written in the following format: month/day/year.

#### **Copies and Signatures**

You will need to submit one copy of this application form. (You may also wish to make a copy for your own records.) Make sure to sign each section appropriately. All photographs should be originals or good-quality color copies.

#### Questions

If you have any questions about this application and whether the school accepts it, check with the school directly.

Submit your completed application directly to the International Student Program (ISP) Coordinator at the school. Incomplete applications cannot be processed.
